

Esashi-Fujiwara Heritage Park is a historical theme park originally built for shooting a period drama about the prosperous Heian period (794 - 1185) Oshu-Fujiwara clan. A Comprehensive Guide

Situated in the southern part of Iwate, Hiraizumi, Ichinoseki, and Oshu are packed with things to see and do centered around the Hiraizumi World Heritage site. Before taking a tour of the area, keep reading to learn about area history, nature, geography, and the Oshu Fujiwara clan!



This northern capital served as the base for three generations of the Oshu Fujiwara clan at the end of the Heian period. During that time, the population was over 100,000, making it the second largest city after the ancient capital of Kyoto. It is now known as the Hiraizumi World Heritage site, welcoming many visitors.


As the southern gateway to Iwate, Ichinoseki borders Hiraizumi on the south. This city has deep connections with the Oshu Fujiwara clan, and is home to many historic sites, such as the Honederamura Shoen ruins, which are connected to Chuson-ji Temple.

Oshu is on the northern edge of the Hiraizumi World Heritage site, and has produced many great people throughout its history. Esashi-Fujiwara Heritage Park is a theme park where you can enjoy a stroll through history and experience the world of the Heian period Oshu Fujiwara clan.





Hiraizumi is not only home to historic sites, but also an abundant natural environment, From Takadachi Gikeido, known as the final resting place of Minamoto no Yoshitsune, you can see the grand Kitakami River and a view of Mount Tabashine, which was written of in one of Saigyo Hoshi's poems, Each year, the Daimonii Okuribi, a ceremonial bonfire, is held on Mount





Oshu is home to abundant, varied natural scenery stretching from east to west, such as Taneyama Highland, beloved by writer Kenji Miyazawa, and the charming valleys, lakes and marshes of the Yakeishi mountain range. Villages of scattered houses typical of idyllic Japanese countryside scenery are another unique feature of the area





Get off the Tohoku Shinkansen at Ichinoseki Station and Hiraizumi is the second station on the outbound Tohoku Main Line. Although you can see the sights on foot, the Runrun Loop Bus is a great mode of transportation

Located on the southernmost edge of lwate prefecture. Ichinoseki is about equidistant from Sendai and Morioka. Boasting the second largest area in the prefecture, this the central city in the southern part of Iwate, and offers direct access to expressways and shinkansen trains.

Oshu covers the third largest area in the prefecture after Ichinoseki. Situated in the southern inland area of lwate. it consists of five areas: Mizusawa, Esashi, Maesawa, Isawa, and Kinugawa.



What is the Hiraizumi World Heritage Site?

Under three generations of prosperous rule by the Oshu Fujiwara clan, twelfth century Hiraizumi developed as the second most prominent city in Japan after the Heian period capital of Kyoto. With the hope of realizing a peaceful country without war, many gardens and temples were built, including Chuson-ji Temple, representing the Pure Land of Buddhism. This group of sites is still well preserved, and while it was influenced by factors from outside of Japan, it developed in its own unique way. It has been highly praised as a unique example of an expression of an ideal world, and was registered as a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage site in 2011.

Site name: Hiraizumi - Temples, Gardens and Archaeological Sites Representing the Buddhist Pure Land

A trip to Iwate would not be complete without a visit to the Hiraizumi-Ichinoseki-Oshu area, which is home to the Hiraizumi World Heritage site and a variety of other related highlights. Touring the historic sites not only gives you the chance to learn about the grand history of the region, but also to get in touch with the architecture and beautiful nature of the area.



Hiraizumi Chuson-ji Temple 1

The spiritual heart representing the Buddhist Pure Land in the modern world

Founded in 850 by Ennin, high priest of Enryaku-ii Temple, it is here that Kiyohira, first generation

leader of the Oshu Fujiwara clan, constructed large-scale temple buildings in the early 12th century. After the fall of the Oshu Fujiwara clan, many Buddhist temples were lost, however, the Konjikido Hall and other buildings designated as national treasures and important cultural assets remain preserved in good condition today.

Hiraizumi Muryōkō-in Ato 4

The pinnacle of Pure Land gardens modeled after the Phoenix Hall at Byodo-in Temple

This is the site of a temple built by Hidehira, the second head of the Oshu Fujiwara clan, and modeled after the Phoenix Hall at Byodo-in Temple (national treasure, World Heritage site) in Kyoto. Built larger in part than the Phoenix Hall, it is thought that the builders were aiming for a temple that exceeded Byodo-in. With the sun setting over the ridge of Mt. Kinkeisan to the west symbolizing the Pure Land, the garden is said to be the pinnacle of Pure Land garden design.

Yanagi Palace Ruins



Because of the superior quality and quantity of discovered items and ruins even among Hiraizumi, it is highly likely that this was the spot of the Hiraizumikan (government offices) noted in the Japanese history text Mirror of the East.

A magnificent space "without equal"

This temple was founded in 850 by Ennin and built by Motohira and Hidehira, the second and third generation heads of the Oshu Fujiwara clan. In its heyday, it counted

over 40 buildings and 500 priests, boasting a scale and magnificence that outshone Chuson-ji Temple. Not only are the Heian period Buddhist temple structures preserved in near perfect condition, but the Pure Land garden has been restored and renovated to carry on ancient traditions in our modern times.

Hiraizumi Kanjizaiō-in Ato 3

A first-class Pure Land Garden with two Amida halls

This is the site of a temple said to have been built by the wife of Motohira, second generation head of the Oshu Fujiwara clan. On the northern shore of Maizuru Pond, a large and small Amida hall were built. The private Buddhist hall has a

quintessentially beautiful female design, and it is thought that it was home to a first-class Pure Land garden built according to the rules of Sakuteiki, Japan's oldest gardening manual.

Hiraizumi Mt. Kinkeisan 5 A hill of faith with a sutra mound built by the Fujiwara clan

At the summit of a hill located nearly midway between Chuson-ji Temple and Motsu-ji Temple there is a mound where sutras were buried by the Oshu Fujiwara clan so that they would be preserved for future generations. Many legends about this hill include a mention in "The Narrow Road to the Deep North" by Japan's most famous poet Matsuo Basho, that a golden hen was buried there to protect Hiraizumi, and that it was built in a single night by a line of laborers stretching to the Kitakami River.


